### Kansas Cattle on Feed

The number of **cattle on feed** on February 1, 2013 in Kansas feedlots with 1,000 head or more capacity totaled 2.11 million head, down 5 percent from a year ago but unchanged from January 1, 2013. This is the lowest February 1 inventory since 1999. **Placements** during January totaled 430,000 head, up 5 percent from a year ago and up 18 percent from December 2012. **Marketings** during January totaled 415,000

head, unchanged from January 2012 but down 2 percent from December 2012. **Other disappearance** was 15,000 head, unchanged from a year ago but down 5,000 head from the previous month. The percent of January placements by weight was: under 600 pounds, 16 percent; 600-699 pounds, 22 percent; 700-799 pounds, 35 percent; and 800 pounds or heavier, 27 percent.

### U.S. Cattle on Feed

**Cattle and calves on feed** for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.1 million head on February 1, 2013. The inventory was 6 percent below February 1, 2012. **Placements** in feedlots during January totaled 1.88 million, 2 percent above 2012. Net placements were 1.80 million head. During January,

placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 445,000, 600-699 pounds were 395,000, 700-799 pounds were 535,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 501,000. **Marketings** of fed cattle during January totaled 1.92 million, 6 percent above 2012. **Other disappearance** totaled 79,000 during January, 2 percent below 2012.

**Kansas Milk Production Up 10.9 Percent and U.S. Up 0.6 Percent**

The January 2013 **milk production in Kansas** totaled 245 million pounds, up 1.7 percent from the December 2012 production of 241 million pounds and up 10.9 percent from January 2012. The **production per cow** averaged 1,855 pounds, up 15 pounds from December 2012 and up 55 pounds from January 2012. The **number of milk cows** was estimated at 132,000 head, up 1,000 head from December 2012 and up 9,000 head from the previous year.

December revised production at 15.7 billion pounds, was up 1.7 percent from December 2011. The December revision represented a decrease of 5 million pounds or less than 0.1 percent from last month's preliminary production estimate. **Production per cow** in the 23 major States averaged 1,871 pounds for January, 11 pounds above January 2012. **The number of milk cows** on farms in the 23 major States was 8.50 million head, 2,000 head less than January 2012, but 6,000 head more than December 2012.

**Milk production** in the 23 major States during January totaled 15.9 billion pounds, up 0.6 percent from January 2012.
