KANSAS CATTLE ON FEED DOWN 6 PERCENT

TOPEKA, KS, December 20, 2013 -- Kansas feedlots, with capacities of 1,000 or more head, contained 2.05 million cattle on feed on December 1, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. This inventory was down 6 percent from last year. This is the lowest December 1 inventory since 1994.

Placements during November totaled 370,000 head, down 1 percent from 2012.

Fed cattle marketings for the month of November totaled 350,000 head, down 10 percent from last year.

Other disappearance during November totaled 20,000 head, up 5,000 head from last year.

KANSAS MILK PRODUCTION UP 7.5 PERCENT

The November 2013 milk production in Kansas totaled 244 million pounds, up 7.5 percent from last year.

The production per cow averaged 1,810 pounds, up 40 pounds from 2012.

The number of cows was estimated at 135,000 head, up 7,000 from the previous year.
