KANSAS CATTLE ON FEED DOWN 3 PERCENT

TOPEKA, KS, February, 21, 2014 -- Kansas feedlots, with capacities of 1,000 or more head, contained 2.05 million cattle on feed on February 1, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. This inventory was down 3 percent from last year. This is the lowest February inventory since 1999.

Placements during January totaled 435,000 head, up 2 percent from 2013.

Fed cattle marketings for the month of January totaled 385,000 head, down 6 percent from last year. This is the lowest January marketings since 1995.

Other disappearance during January totaled 10,000 head, down 5,000 head from last year.

KANSAS MILK PRODUCTION UP 5.3 PERCENT

The January 2014 milk production in Kansas totaled 258 million pounds, up 5.3 percent from last year.

The production per cow averaged 1,880 pounds, up 25 pounds from 2013.

The number of cows was estimated at 137,000 head, up 5,000 from the previous year.
