2019 Louisiana Honey Production Up 4 Percent

Honey production during 2019 from Louisiana producers with five or more colonies totaled 3.89 million pounds, up 4 percent from 2018. There were 54,000 honey producing colonies in 2019, up 9,000 colonies from previous year. Yield per colony averaged 72 pounds of honey, down 13 percent from 2018. Honey stocks held by producers on December 15, 2019, were 428,000 pounds, up 64 percent from a year earlier. The average price for honey increased from \$1.91 per pound in 2018 to \$2.04 per pound in 2019. The total value of honey production totaled \$7.93 million, up 11 percent from the previous year.


