Excellent Week for Field Work: Delaware had 5 and Maryland had 6 days suitable for field work. Last week both states finished planting potatoes and green peas and Apple trees are nearly full bloom in Delaware. In Delaware soybeans planted ahead by 23 percent compare to last year and winter wheat nearly fully headed.

In Maryland temperatures reached a high of 90 Fahrenheit degree in Oxon Hill and low 35 Fahrenheit degree. Field work activities included soybeans planting, tomatoes, watermelon, cucumber, and cantaloupes planting and early strawberries harvesting
