According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 5.7 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, November 10, 2013**. Almost all field crops have been harvested and most cool season crops and forages have been planted. Even with this year’s late planting in most areas, yields seem to be good for most crops. Soil moisture was rated 0 percent very short, 7 percent short, 88 percent adequate, and 5 percent surplus.
