Mississippi Crop Progress and Condition Report

Week Ending October 15, 2017

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Mississippi, there were 6.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, October 15, 2017**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 7 percent very short, 40 percent short, 51 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 6 percent very short, 36 percent short, 56 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 50.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Tunica to 73.6 degrees Fahrenheit at Biloxi. Highs ranged from 70.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Tunica to 90.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Yazoo City. Most of the state received some rain, with the highest concentration in the south-central part of the state with an average of 1.40 inches.
