



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released June 26, 2015

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2015 was 2.90 million head, up 2 percent from March 1, 2015 and up 18 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 395,000 head, was down 1 percent from the previous quarter but up 4 percent from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.51 million head, was up 2 percent from last quarter and up 21 percent from last year.

The March-May 2015 pig crop, at 2.08 million head, was up 26 percent from 2014. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 200,000 head, was up 8 percent from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.40 for the March-May period, compared with 8.90 last year.
