



Missouri June Acreage

Released June 30, 2015

Corn: Planted area, at 3.20 million acres, is down 9 percent from 2014. This represents the lowest acres planted acreage in Missouri since 2010 when 3.15 million acres were planted. Harvested area for grain, at 3.05 million acres, is down 10 percent from the previous year.

Soybeans: Planted area, at 5.75 million acres, is up 2 percent from 2014. This represents the third largest acreage planted on record for Missouri. At 5.70 million acres, harvested area is up 2 percent from last year, as well.

Winter wheat: Planted area, estimated at 800,000 acres, is down 9 percent from 2014. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 710,000 acres down 4 percent from the previous year.

Hay: Harvested area of all hay is expected to total 3.51 million acres, up 0.8 percent from 2014. This consists of 210,000 acres of alfalfa and 3.30 million acres of all other hay.

Cotton: Planted area at 175,000 acres, is down 30 percent from 2014. This would be the lowest planted acres since 1985, which 152,000 acres were planted.

Rice: Planted area, at 215,000 acres, is down 1,000 acres from 2014. Harvested area, forecast at 212,000 acres, is also down 1,000 acres from the previous year.
