



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released June 24, 2016

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2016 was 2.95 million head, the same as March 1, 2016 but up 2 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 395,000 head, was up 3 percent from the previous quarter but the same as last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.56 million head, was down slightly from last quarter but up 2 percent from last year.

The March-May 2016 pig crop, at 1.99 million head, was down 4 percent from 2015. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 200,000 head, the same as a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 9.95 for the March-May period, compared with 10.4 last year.


