



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released September 30, 2016

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on September 1, 2016 was 3.20 million head, up 8 percent from June 1, 2016 and up 3 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 395,000 head, was unchanged from the previous quarter but down 5,000 head from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.81 million head, was up 10 percent from last quarter and up 4 percent from last year.

The June-Aug 2016 pig crop, at 2.17 million head, was up 3 percent from 2015. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 215,000 head, the same as a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.10 for the June-Aug period, compared with 9.85 last year.


