



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released June 29, 2017

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2017 was 3.30 million head, up 6 percent from March 1, 2017 and up 10 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 440,000 head, was down 5,000 from the previous quarter but up 45,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.86 million head, was up 8 percent from last quarter and up 10 percent from last year.

The March-May 2017 pig crop, at 2.31 million head, was up 13 percent from 2016. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 225,000 head, up 20,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.25 for the March-May period, compared with 9.95 last year.


