



Missouri Agricultural Prices

Released June 28, 2018

The May Prices Received Index (Agricultural Production), at 94.3, increased 1.7 percent from April 2018. At 89.0, the Crop Production Index increased 1.1 percent. The Livestock Production Index, at 97.7, increased 2.0 percent. Producers received higher prices for broilers, milk, hogs, and oranges but lower prices for market eggs, strawberries, apples, and calves. Compared with a year earlier, the Prices Received Index is down 3.9 percent. The Crop Production Index increased 3.4 percent but the Livestock Production Index decreased 8.5 percent. In addition to prices, the indexes are influenced by the volume change of commodities producers market. Increased monthly movement of cattle, broilers, hay, and sweet corn offset the decreased marketing of soybeans, hogs, calves, and apples. The Food Commodities Index, at 97.7, increased 1.8 percent from the previous month but decreased 5.8 percent from May 2017.

To stay on track for data release in February 2019, the deadline for submitting the paper questionnaire is June 15, 2018. Farmers and ranchers who have not responded by June 15, 2018 still have until the end of July to complete the Census online through the secure website found on the cover of their Census form. Phone follow-up and personal interviews will also continue through July.
