



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released June 28, 2018

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2018 was 3.50 million head, up 1 percent from March 1, 2018 and up 8 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 460,000 head, was up 5,000 from the previous quarter and up 20,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 3.04 million head, was up 2 percent from last quarter and up 8 percent from last year.

The March-May 2018 pig crop, at 2.45 million head, was up 9 percent from 2017. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 240,000 head, up 20,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.20 for the March-May period, compared with 10.25 last year.



There's still time to fill out and return your 2017 Census of Agriculture! If you produce or grow any agricultural products, including field crops, fruits, vegetables, floriculture, and livestock, regardless of the size of your operation, return your 2017 Census of Agriculture as soon as possible.

To stay on track for data release in February 2019, the deadline for submitting the paper questionnaire is June 15, 2018. Farmers and ranchers who have not responded by June 15, 2018 still have until the end of July to complete the Census online through the secure website found on the cover of their Census form. Phone follow-up and personal interviews will also continue through July.
