



Missouri June Acreage

Released June 29, 2018

Corn: Planted area, at 3.40 million acres, unchanged from 2017. Harvested area for grain, at 3.25 million acres, is also unchanged from the previous year.

Soybeans: Planted area, at 5.80 million acres, is down 3 percent from 2017. Harvested area is expected to total 5.73 million acres, down 3 percent from last year.

Winter wheat: Planted area for 2018, estimated at 660,000 acres, is up 3 percent from 2017. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 530,000 acres, down 2 percent from the previous year.

Hay: Harvested area of all hay is expected to total 3.53 million acres, up 18 percent from 2017. This total includes 330,000 acres of alfalfa and 3.20 million acres of all other hay.

Cotton: Planted area, at 345,000 acres, is up 13 percent from 2017. This is the highest planted area since 2012, when 350,000 acres were planted.

Rice: Planted area, at 199,000 acres, is up 18 percent from 2017. Harvested area, forecast at 194,000 acres, is up 21 percent from the previous year.

To stay on track for data release in February 2019, farmers and ranchers have until the end of July to complete the Census online through the secure website found on the cover of their Census form. Phone follow-up and personal interviews will also continue through July.
