



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released September 27, 2019

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on September 1, 2019 was 3.60 million head, unchanged from June 1, 2019 but down 4 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 490,000 head, was up 10,000 from the previous quarter and up 25,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 3.11 million head, was down slightly from last quarter and down 5 percent from last year.

The June-August 2019 pig crop, at 2.78 million head, was up 4 percent from 2018. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 250,000 head, down 5,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 11.10 for the June-August period, compared with 10.45 last year.


