



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released June 25, 2020

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2020 was 3.90 million head, up 4 percent from March 1, 2020 and up 7 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 475,000 head, was up 5,000 from the previous quarter but down 5,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 3.43 million head, was up 4 percent from last quarter and up 8 percent from last year.

The March-May 2020 pig crop, at 2.81 million head, was up 9 percent from 2019. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 255,000 head, up 13,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 11.00 for the March-May period, compared with 10.65 last year.


