

Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released March 28, 2024

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on March 1, 2024 was 3.25 million head, up 3 percent from December 1, 2023 but down 3 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 435,000 head, was down 5,000 from the previous quarter and down 35,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.82 million head, was up 4 percent from last quarter but down 2 percent from last year.

The December-February 2024 pig crop, at 2.43 million head, was down slightly from 2023. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 215,000 head, down 15,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 11.30 for the December-February period, compared with 10.60 last year.


