UNITED STATES

July Prices Received Index Down 0.5 Percent

The July Prices Received Index 2011 Base (Agricultural Production), at 106.9, decreased 0.5 percent from June but increased 2.3 percent from July 2020. At 106.7, the Crop Production Index was down 0.4 percent from last month but up 21 percent from the previous year. The Livestock Production Index, at 107.1, decreased 0.6 percent from June, but increased 27 percent from July last year. Producers received lower prices during July for milk, broilers, grapes, and hogs but higher prices for corn, market eggs, cattle, and lettuce. In addition to prices, the volume change of commodities marketed also influences the indexes. In July, there was decreased marketing of milk, cattle, oranges, and broilers and increased monthly movement for grapes, wheat, hay, and cotton.

July Prices Paid Index Up 0.8 Percent

The July Prices Paid Index for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates (PPITW), at 116.0, is up 0.8 percent from June 2021 and 7.0 percent from July 2020. Higher prices in July for feeder cattle, nitrogen, mixed fertilizer, and hay & forages more than offset lower prices for feeder pigs, concentrates, and complete feeds.
