GRAIN STOCKS – JUNE 1, 2023

ARIZONA

Off-farm **corn** stocks in Arizona on June 1, 2023, were 1.97 million bushels, down 28 percent from June 1, 2022, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Other Arizona grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

COLORADO

Colorado **corn** stocks in all positions on June 1, 2023, were 25.03 million bushels, down 25 percent from June 1, 2022, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Corn stored on farms amounted to 15.00 million bushels, down 6 percent from a year ago. Corn stored off farms amounted to 10.03 million bushels, down 42 percent from a year ago, representing the lowest June 1 off-farm corn stocks total since 1997. Off-farm **sorghum** stocks totaled 743,000 bushels on June 1, 2023, down 48 percent from last year.

All wheat stocks in all positions in Colorado on June 1, 2023, were 12.19 million bushels, down 38 percent from June 1, 2022. All wheat stored on farms amounted to 1.50 million bushels, down 6 percent from a year ago. This represents the lowest June 1 on farm all wheat stocks total since 2008. All wheat stored off farms amounted to 10.69 million bushels, down 41 percent from a year ago. Offfarm **oat** stocks totaled 31,000 bushels on June 1, 2023. Off-farm **barley** stocks totaled 1.37 million bushels, down 69 percent from last year. Other Colorado grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

MONTANA

Oat stocks in all positions in Montana on June 1, 2023, were 160,000 bushels, down 13 percent from June 1, 2022, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Oats stored off-farm were down 23 percent from last year to 10,000 bushels. Oats stored on farm amounted to 150,000 bushels, down 12 percent from a year ago, and represents the lowest on-farm June 1 oat stocks on record. Montana **barley** stocks in all positions on June 1, 2023, were 8.85 million bushels, up 18 percent from a year ago. Barley stored on farms was 3.20 million bushels, up 7 percent from last year. Off-farm barley storage was up 25 percent from a year ago to 5.66 million bushels.

All wheat stocks in all positions in Montana on June 1, 2023, were 45.86 million bushels, up 27 percent from June 1, 2022. All wheat stocks stored on farms amounted to 24.00 million bushels, up 33 percent from a year ago. All wheat stored off farms amounted to 21.86 million bushels, up 20 percent from a year ago. Durum wheat stocks in all positions on June 1, 2023, were 9.07 million bushels, up 76 percent from a year ago. Durum wheat stocks stored on farms amounted to 4.90 million bushels, and Durum wheat stored off farms amounted to 4.17 million bushels. Other Montana grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

NEW MEXICO

New Mexico grain stocks on June 1, 2023, were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

UTAH

Off-farm **all wheat** stocks in Utah on June 1, 2023, were 3.16 million bushels, according to the June 1 Agricultural Survey and June Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. This is down 11 percent from June 1, 2022. Other Utah grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

WYOMING

Wyoming grain stocks on June 1, 2023, were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

UNITED STATES

Corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2023 totaled 4.11 billion bushels, down 6 percent from June 1, 2022. Of the total stocks, 2.22 billion bushels are stored on farms, up 5 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 1.89 billion bushels, are down 15 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2023 indicated disappearance is 3.29 billion bushels, compared with 3.41 billion bushels during the same period last year.

Grain sorghum stored in all positions on June 1, 2023 totaled 53.0 million bushels, down 51 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks, at 6.38 million bushels, are up 81 percent from last year. Off-farm stocks, at 46.6 million bushels, are down 55 percent from June 1, 2022. The March - May 2023 indicated disappearance from all positions is 55.8 million bushels, down 44 percent from the same period last year.

Old crop oats stored in all positions on June 1, 2023 totaled 34.8 million bushels, 7 percent above the stocks on June 1, 2022. Of the total stocks on hand, 13.8 million bushels are stored on farms, 40 percent above a year ago. Off-farm stocks totaled 21.0 million bushels, 8 percent below the previous year. Indicated disappearance during March - May 2023 totaled 8.11 million bushels, 22 percent below the same period a year ago.

Old crop barley stocks in all positions on June 1, 2023 totaled 56.3 million bushels, up 34 percent from June 1, 2022. On-farm stocks are estimated at 17.4 million bushels, 78 percent above a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 38.9 million bushels, are 20 percent above June 1, 2022. The March - May 2023 indicated disappearance is 32.4 million bushels, 6 percent above the same period a year earlier.

Old crop all wheat stored in all positions on June 1, 2023 totaled 580 million bushels, down 17 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 124 million bushels, up 34 percent from last year. Off-farm stocks, at 456 million bushels, are down 25 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2023 indicated disappearance is 366 million bushels, up 11 percent from the same period a year earlier.

Old crop Durum wheat stocks in all positions on June 1, 2023 totaled 28.0 million bushels, up 18 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks, at 12.8 million bushels, are up 38 percent from June 1, 2022. Off-farm stocks totaled 15.3 million bushels, up 6 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2023 indicated disappearance of 7.77 million bushels is up 18 percent from the same period a year earlier.

Pulse crops stored in all positions on June 1, 2023 and the change from June 1, 2022 are: **dry edible peas**, 3.96 million cwt, up 26 percent; **lentils**, 1.04 million cwt, down 2 percent; all chickpeas, 1.50 million cwt, down 24 percent; **small chickpeas**, 444 thousand cwt, up 11 percent; and **large chickpeas**, 1.05 million cwt, down 33 percent. Small chickpeas are defined as peas that will pass through a 20/64 inch round hole screen. Large chickpeas are defined as larger than 20/64 inches.
