

## VERMONT CATTLE COUNTY ESTIMATES

Vermont's cattle and calf herd totaled 295,000 head as of January 1, 2001. Franklin county contained the largest number of cattle and calves with an estimated 65,500 head or 22 percent of Vermont's cattle and calf inventory. Addison and Orleans counties followed Franklin county with 63,300 and 42,900 cattle and calves respectively.

There were 158,000 milk cows in Vermont as of January 1, 2001, which accounted for 54 percent of Vermont's cattle and calf inventory. Nearly 40,000 of Vermont's milk cows were located in Franklin county followed by Addison and Orleans county with 33,500 and 25,000 milk cows respectively.
