Statewide, seven days were suitable for field work. Topsoil moisture was 37% short and 63% adequate. Subsoil moisture was 19% very short, 10% short, and 71% adequate. Pasture and range condition was 26% poor, 4% fair, 18% good, and 52% excellent.

<b>BEETS</b>	Harvesting very good quality product in fair volume. Tops will be hurt by frost first. Available thru Thanksgiving.
<b>CABBAGE</b>	Harvesting very good quality products in fair to decreasing volume. Can tolerate some frost. Available thru Thanksgiving.
<b>CILANTRO</b>	Finishing up.
<b>COLLARDS/KALE</b>	Harvesting very good quality and fair to decreasing volume. Can tolerate some frost. Available thru Thanksgiving.
<b>DANDELIONS</b>	Good quality San Pasquale variety available in fair to decreasing volume.
<b>EGGPLANT</b>	Finishing up.
<b>ESCAROLE &amp; ENDIVE</b>	Harvesting excellent quality products in fair to decreasing volume. Can tolerate a bit of frost.
<b>LEEKES</b>	Harvesting a fair volume of good quality product.
<b>LETTUCES</b>	Finishing up.
<b>PARSLEY</b>	Harvesting a light to decreasing volume of very good quality curly and plain product.
<b>PEPPERS</b>	Finishing up.
<b>RADISHES</b>	Harvesting very good quality in fair volume.
<b>SPINACH</b>	Finishing up.
<b>SQUASH</b>	Fair volume of good quality hard squashes like acorn and butternut harvested, curing, and in storage through Thanksgiving.
<b>SWEET POTATOES</b>	Harvesting very good quality in good volume.
<b>SWISS CHARD</b>	Harvesting excellent quality in fair to decreasing volume.
<b>TURNIPS</b>	Harvesting very good quality in good volume.
<b>WHITE POTATOES</b>	Harvested, and in storage, mainly round white varieties, with some Yukon Gold, Redskin varieties, and a bit of Russets as well.
