According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New Jersey, there were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, June 18, 2023. Topsoil moisture supplies were 6 percent short and 94 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 15 percent short and 85 percent adequate. Pasture conditions were 5 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 31 percent fair, and 58 percent good.

We will start to see some Spring Snow and Manon white-fleshed peaches and larger volumes of yellow fleshed peaches. Finishing up Rich May and starting with Desiree, Flamin Fury PF 5B, Flamin Fury PF 1, Carored, and Early Star. Volumes will be spotty of these very early clingstone varieties. We expect some good, sweet flavor and high red color with the weather we have had. While dry, most growers have had irrigation to supplement the lack of natural rainfall for this abundant crop |
