



The Census of Horticultural Specialties collects information to provide a comprehensive and detailed picture of the horticultural sector of the U.S. economy. It is the only source of detailed production and sales data for floriculture. nursery and specialty crops. This publication's main focus will be the state of New Jersey.

The 2009 Census of Horticulture counted 623 operations in New Jersey with sales of \$347,601,000 a decrease of 122 operations since the 1998 Census of Horticulture. However, sales of horticulture crops increased by 44 percent over this same time period.

Categories where sales increased since the last Census of Horticulture included Nursery Stock, Annual Bedding and Garden Plants, Cut Flowers, Transplants for Commercial Vegetable Production, Potted Herbaceous Perennial Plants, and Propagative Materials.

Categories with a lower sales from the previous Census of Horticulture, included Sod Sprigs or Plugs, Potted Flowering Plants, Cut Christmas Trees, Foliage Plants, and Food Crops Under Protection.




