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VEGETABLES 2022 SUMMARY

ARIZONA

Arizona harvested 61,400 acres of lettuce in 2022, down 3 percent from the 63,600 acres harvested in 2021, according to the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Of that, 27,000 acres were head lettuce, 10,900 acres were leaf lettuce, and 23,500 acres were Romaine lettuce. The state produced 19.98 million hundredweight (cwt) of lettuce in 2022, with a value of utilized lettuce production of \$969.07 million in 2022, up sharply from \$651.06 million in 2021.

COLORADO

Colorado harvested 2,700 acres of onions in 2022, down 10 percent from the 3,000 acres harvested in 2021, according to the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. The state produced 1.30 million hundredweight (cwt) of onions in 2022, a decrease of less than 1 percent from the 1.31 million cwt produced in 2021. The value of utilized onion production increased to \$28.03 million in 2022, up 13 percent from \$24.76 million in 2021.

NEW MEXICO

New Mexico harvested 8,200 acres of chile peppers in 2022, down 4 percent from 8,500 acres harvested in 2021, according to the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. The state produced 1.07 million hundredweight (cwt) of chile peppers in 2022, an increase of 5 percent from the 1.02 million cwt produced in 2021. The value of utilized chile pepper production increased to \$46.21 million in 2022, up 3 percent from \$45.03 million in 2021.

UNITED STATES

In 2022, the Nation's production for the 26 estimated vegetable and melon crops totaled 658 million cwt, down 2 percent from 2021. The utilized production totaled 655 million cwt, down 2 percent from 2021. Area harvested in 2022 was 2.14 million acres, down 5 percent from 2021. The top three vegetables, in terms of area harvested, were sweet corn, tomatoes, and snap beans. In terms of total production, the three largest crops were tomatoes, onions, and sweet corn, which combined accounted for 53 percent of the all vegetables total.

The value of utilized production for 2022 vegetable crops was \$16.5 billion, up 27 percent from the previous year. Tomatoes, onions, and romaine lettuce claimed the highest values, accounting for 30 percent of the utilized value of production when combined.
