Fair week for field work: New York averaged 4.0 days suitable for field work.

Temperatures ranged from 1.31 degrees below to 5.07 degrees above normal and weekly precipitation ranged from 0 to 1.65 inches throughout the state. Wet and windy weather continued to delay field work, with standing water making it difficult for dry hay to be harvested. Most planting has stopped due to the continued rain, except for some dairy farmers trying to ensure feed for their cows. Strawberry and pea harvest have begun and with the warmer weather corn is starting to grow.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome County; Maria Heath:

Severe thunderstorms, damaging winds hitting different spots in the county. Standing water on heavier soils. Corn is starting to grow with warmer weather.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:

A few nice days had more hay and late planting of crops, but still short of planned planting acres.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Some producers in Ontario County are still trying to plant. Dry hay was attempted to be harvested this week but reports of the ground being saturated didn't help. Some producers are reporting prevented plantings of corn and soybeans. Strawberry and pea harvest have started.

Oswego County; Ellen deMey:

Weather continues to delay field work. Dairy farms are continuing to try to plant in an effort to ensure feed for cows. Some dry hay has been cut but most fields are overripe.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Except for heavy rain overnight on Tuesday, the week remained sunny & dry. Some planting is still being done, but most has stopped.

Yates County; Amy Parmelee, Farm Service Agency

Many farmers have decided it is beyond getting any more corn or soybeans planted due to all the continued rains.
