According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New York, there were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, August 4th, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 7 percent short, 73 percent adequate, and 20 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 2 percent very short, 3 percent short, 78 percent adequate, and 17 percent surplus. Pasture conditions ranged from 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 41 percent good, and 17 percent excellent.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Cayuga County; Colleen Cargile, Cayuga County FSA:

Warm, dry weather was present for much of the week. The crops continue to look better each day. The earlier planted corn is beginning to tassel and form ears, and soybeans are beginning to bloom and form pods. Most of the wheat has been harvested and yields have been reported to be fairly good. The soil is beginning to get a little dry and a shower definitely wouldn't hurt, but the crops look good at the moment. I think everyone is thankful for all the nice stretches of weather that we've had, as it has really allowed the crops to catch up and actually look pretty decent. Earlier this spring, I think many people said that they didn't think the crops were going to make it. Hopefully the nice weather continues and we get a few showers here and there to keep the crops growing.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:

Corn height varies from 1' to full tassel. Small grains are turning, nearing harvest. Pasture growth has halted, and rain has been very scattered.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

A good week for continued crop advancement.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County experienced pop up showers at the beginning of the week but by the weeks end had a string of sunny days for hay making and combining small grains.
