According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New York, there were 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, August 25th, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 2 percent very short, 10 percent short, 72 percent adequate, and 16 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 2 percent very short, 8 percent short, 75 percent adequate, and 15 percent surplus. Pasture conditions ranged from 2 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 15 percent excellent.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Late summer forage seeding is still being planted. Sub-surface drainage installation progressing rapidly. Hay crop silage and dry hay harvest continuing. Early planted corn silage will be ready for harvest soon. Soybeans making rapid growth - excellent bloom and pollination weather.

Lewis County; Joe Lawrence:

Some areas of the county received heavy rainfall midweek, while other areas received very light rains. Most crops continue to look pretty good if you ignore that fact that it is late August. Heat accumulation in the coming weeks and date of first frost will have a huge impact on crop outcomes for many acres. While there is some corn that surely will not mature, even for silage.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

Crop and field conditions remain favorable.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County continues with hay and vegetable harvest; some fall tillage has started.

Oswego County; Ellen deMey:

Wet weather has come and go with passing storms making already wet soil even more difficult to traverse. Dry hay is still being made when the conditions are right but yields are down. Corn height is variable depending on soil type and ears have developed. Soybeans are blooming and pods are evident.

Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

Veraison, the start of ripening, is progressing rapidly in Long Island vineyards. Crews are applying netting to protect fruit from hungry birds.
