USDA forecasts record highs for 2023 New York corn and soybean crops

ALBANY, NY --- The USDA-NASS has released the crop production forecast for November, according to Charles Walker, state statistician of the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS), New York Field Office. The latest survey, which was conducted during the last week of October and first week of November, included the following commodities:

Corn: Production is forecast at a record high 102 million bushels, up 26% from 2022. Based on conditions as of November 1, yields are expected to average a record high 168.0 bushels per acre, 28 bushels above the 2022 average. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 605 thousand acres, up 30 thousand acres from 2022.

Soybean: Production is forecast at a record high 17.9 million bushels, up 23% from 2022. Based on November 1 conditions, yields are expected to average a 52.0 bushels per acre, up 7 bushels from last year. Area for harvest is forecast at 345 thousand acres, up 20 thousand acres from last year.

Production forecasts are released monthly and do not reflect final production estimates. Fall harvests may change these estimates considerably. The next production forecast will be issued December 8, 2023.
