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



The production of fresh, safe, nutritious food for our growing populations is one of the objectives of the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Research is clearly the key to the continued development of knowledge and technologies to support the North Carolina agricultural industry, our citizens across the state and people of the world. The Research Stations Division, a cooperative effort between NCDA&CS, North Carolina State University and North Carolina A&T State University serves a vital role in this effort.

The agricultural research system in North Carolina dates to 1877, when state legislation established the North Carolina Department of Agriculture along with the "Experiment Stations" as a division of the department. Fifteen research stations were purchased over the years, beginning with the Upper Coastal Plain Research Station at Rocky Mount in 1902. Each research station location was selected based on specific criteria, such as soil type, climatic conditions, geographic location and goal specific requirements. Stations can be grouped into three basic research categories: field crops, horticultural crops and livestock/poultry. The program expanded in 1974 with the transfer of facilities and land from other state agencies. The current program operates 18 research stations.

The 18 research stations serve as the platform for agriculture research by providing land, equipment, personnel, and supplies to support research. Over time, the stations have diversified from a single or limited focus to include multiple project areas. Research stations continue to address concerns associated with traditional agriculture commodities and practices including tobacco, corn, soybeans, cotton, peanuts, small grains, swine and dairy. Of the research projects conducted in 2010, 52% were specific to these commodities. With the changes in agriculture and the need for diversification, 24% of projects conducted in 2010 focused on the production of vegetables (sweetpotatos, peppers, broccoli, cabbage, cucumbers, etc.) and fruits (apples, peaches,





◀ The swine production facilities at the Cherry Research Farm in Goldsboro produce pigs in hoop structures and an antibiotic free environment.


strawberries, blueberries, blackberries, raspberries, grapes, etc). Other areas of research include aquaculture, Christmas trees, forestry, ornamentals, herbs, specialty crops, pest management and biofuels crops.

In addition to being the platform for agriculture research for the state, the stations also provide numerous educational opportunities to growers and the community through field days, workshops and tours. During 2010 the stations had 14,096 visitors attending 296 events. Stations provide tours to school groups and community organizations to provide an overview of agriculture operations and ongoing research. The key events on a station are the field days that begin in March and continue through September. These events focus on a specific area of research such as small fruits, tomatoes, strawberries and high tunnel production for extended growing seasons.

# STATISTICAL REPORTS PROGRAM

The North Carolina Field Office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service compiles current and historic statistics concerning agriculture in the State. Where possible, information most often requested by farmers, the general public, and workers in government agencies are included. Reporting of crop and livestock statistics is a service provided to farmers and others in the State by the National Agricultural Statistics Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture in cooperation with the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. The collection and dissemination of agricultural statistics had its start in 1863. This is one of the oldest activities of the United States Department of Agriculture. It was recognized that there were many advantages of a joint relationship between the State and Federal Governments in the development of agricultural statistics. In 1919, the N.C. Department of Agriculture entered into a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to provide detailed agricultural statistics. The agreement resulted in the creation of the Agricultural Statistics Division of the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. The North Carolina Field Office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service publishes official statistics on crops, livestock, prices, and various other agricultural items. The most important reports and the approximate dates of releases are shown in the table below. The reports marked with an (\*) are issued separately and are only available at [www.ncagr.com/stats](http://www.ncagr.com/stats). All others are included in the monthly release entitled "Farm Report." These reports are free and available by writing to: Director, Agricultural Statistics, P.O. 

## 2010 WEATHER SUMMARY

The year began with the state being drought free due to a wet fall in 2009. The winter months experienced below average temperatures and above normal precipitation. It was a long, cold winter but by April it warmed up and temperatures were above normal. On May 2nd, 26 counties in Central and Southeastern NC were considered abnormally dry due to lack of rainfall and hot temperatures. Hot, dry conditions continued throughout the summer and 2010 became one of the hottest years on record.


By the end of September, 74 counties were experiencing moderate drought conditions with the Mountain and Northern Coastal regions seeing the most impact. Tropical Depression Nicole brought record breaking rain in early October and lessened drought impacts for Coastal Regions. However, the drought had already impacted most crops and yields suffered. On December 28, 18 counties were designated as moderate drought and 40 counties were considered abnormally dry.

## DEFINITIONS & METHODOLOGY

Cash receipts for agricultural commodities are defined as the gross income from sales of crops, livestock, and livestock products during a calendar year. The USDA, Economic Research Service (ERS) uses USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) estimates to develop state level cash receipts. The county level cash receipts in this publication are based on the ERS state level cash receipts and various county data. To ensure respondent confidentiality, estimates at any level, including county estimates, are not published if those estimates would disclose any information about individual operations. 


# SOURCE OF FARM CASH RECEIPTS, NORTH CAROLINA, 2010




## CROPS CASH RECEIPTS LEADING COUNTIES





## MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR CORN (Dollars per Bushel)




## MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR COTTON (Dollars per Pound)




Appalachian Region (Dollars per Ton) <sup>1</sup>

## PRICES PAID FOR FUELS


Appalachian Region (Dollars per Gallon) <sup>1</sup>









*(Bearing and Non-Bearing Acres)*




## TOP BLUEBERRY COUNTIES
