




PEANUT YIELD (Pounds)




SOYBEAN YIELD (Bushels)



CORN FOR GRAIN YIELD (Bushels)




UPLAND COTTON YIELD (Pounds)



MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR SOYBEANS




MONTHLY PRICE RECEIVED FOR WINTER WHEAT

(Dollars per Bushel)




