Still time to respond to the 2022 Census of Agriculture

USDA to follow up with North Carolina producers who have not yet responded

Raleigh, NC – February 17, 2023 – Farmers and ranchers in North Carolina still have time to be counted in the 2022 Census of Agriculture, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS). Although the deadline for submitting the ag census has just passed, NASS will continue to accept completed census questionnaires through the spring to ensure all farmers and ranchers take advantage of the opportunity to be represented in the widely used data.

"We would like to thank the roughly 35% of North Carolina farmers that have responded to the 2022 Census of Agriculture so far." said NASS's State Statistician Dee Webb. "However, we want to ensure and encourage all farmers to take advantage of the opportunity to be represented in the widely used census data. NC farmers start to lose their voice when we don't have enough data to publish for commodities or localities. Response means strong data and strong data lead to better informed decisions."

NASS will continue to follow up with NC producers through the spring with mailings, phone calls, and personal visits. Farmers and ranchers are encouraged to complete their ag census either online at <u>agcounts.usda.gov</u> or by mail as soon as possible.

Federal law under Title 7 USC 2204(g) Public Law 105-113 mandates that everyone who received the 2022 Census of Agriculture questionnaire complete and return it, even if they are not currently farming. The same law requires NASS to keep all submissions confidential, use the information for statistical purposes only, and publish aggregate data to prevent disclosing the identity of any individual producer or farm operation.
