NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 13, 2018 - For the week ending November 11, 2018, there were 3.1 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 5 percent very short, 20 short, 69 adequate, and 6 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 9 percent very short, 28 short, 58 adequate, and 5 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Soybeans harvested was 91 percent, behind 99 both last year and for the five-year average.

Winter wheat condition rated 1 percent very poor, 2 poor, 23 fair, 64 good, and 10 excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 94 percent, equal to last year.

Corn harvested was 62 percent, behind 74 last year and 78 average.

Sunflowers harvested was 68 percent, behind 80 last year and 74 average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 7 percent very poor, 18 poor, 43 fair, 31 good, and 1 excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 8 percent very short, 27 short, 64 adequate, and 1 surplus.
