NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 4, 2019 - For the week ending November 3, 2019, there were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 0 percent very short, 0 short, 46 adequate, and 54 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 0 percent very short, 0 short, 53 adequate, and 47 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Soybean condition rated 6 percent very poor, 12 poor, 34 fair, 46 good, and 2 excellent. Soybeans harvested was 56 percent, well behind 85 last year and 95 for the five-year average.

Durum wheat harvested was 97 percent.

Winter wheat condition rated 1 percent very poor, 2 poor, 17 fair, 72 good, and 8 excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 87 percent, near 91 last year, and behind 92 average.

Corn condition rated 2 percent very poor, 8 poor, 30 fair, 55 good, and 5 excellent. Corn mature was 95 percent, behind 100 last year, and near 99 average. Harvested was 10 percent, well behind 47 last year and 60 average.

Canola harvested was 92 percent.

Sugarbeets harvested was 67 percent, well behind 97 last year and 99 average.

Sunflower condition rated 7 percent very poor, 15 poor, 28 fair, 46 good, and 4 excellent. Sunflowers harvested was 25 percent, well behind 59 last year and 65 average.

Flaxseed harvested was 93 percent.

Potatoes harvested was 73 percent.

Dry edible beans harvested was 77 percent.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 2 percent very poor, 8 poor, 24 fair, 56 good, and 10 excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 0 percent very short, 3 short, 65 adequate, and 32 surplus.
