AGRICULTURAL PRICES

FARGO, ND, September 27, 2013 -- Preliminary prices received by farmers for spring wheat for September 2013 averaged \$6.50 per bushel, a decrease of 43 cents from the August price according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Durum wheat, at \$8.00 per bushel, increased 26 cents from the previous month. Winter wheat averaged \$6.20 per bushel, a decrease of 34 cents from August.

The preliminary September feed barley price, at \$3.10 per bushel, is down 98 cents from last month. The malting barley price, at \$5.30, is down 87 cents from last month.

The preliminary September oat price, at \$3.15 per bushel, decreased 2 cents from last month.

The preliminary September corn price, at \$4.80 per bushel, decreased \$1.17 from last month.

The preliminary September soybean price, at \$13.10 per bushel, is unchanged from last month.

The preliminary September all dry edible bean price, at \$38.60 per cwt, decreased 70 cents from last month. The pinto price for August averaged \$40.00 per cwt while the navy price averaged \$36.90 per cwt.

The preliminary September all sunflowers price, at \$23.20 per cwt, is down 70 cents from the previous month.

The preliminary September flaxseed price, at \$14.40 per bushel, is down 50 cents from last month.

The preliminary September canola price averaged \$20.00 per cwt, a decrease of \$2.20 from August.

The September alfalfa hay price, at \$118.00 per ton, is up \$3.00 from last month. The other hay price, at \$76.00 per ton, is down \$1.00 from last month.

The preliminary September prices for fresh and processing potatoes were withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
