NORTH DAKOTA AGRICULTURAL PRICES

FARGO, ND, April 30, 2014 -- Preliminary prices received by farmers for spring wheat for April 2014 averaged \$6.50 per bushel, an increase of 8 cents from the March price according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Durum wheat, at \$7.00 per bushel, increased 28 cents from the previous month. Winter wheat averaged \$6.50 per bushel, a increase of 11 cents from March.

The preliminary April feed barley price, at \$3.50 per bushel, is down 15 cents from last month. The malting barley price, at \$5.50, is down 44 cents from last month.

The preliminary April corn price, at \$4.00 per bushel, increased 5 cents from last month.

The preliminary April soybean price, at \$13.30 per bushel, is up 60 cents from last month.

The preliminary April all dry edible bean price, at \$31.00 per cwt, decreased 40 cents from last month. The pinto price for March averaged \$31.30 per cwt.

The preliminary April all sunflowers price, at \$24.70 per cwt, is up \$1.60 from the previous month.

The preliminary April canola price averaged \$18.80 per cwt, an increase of 40 cents from March.

The April alfalfa hay price, at \$102.00 per ton, is up \$1.00 from last month. The other hay price, at \$69.00 per ton, is down \$1.00 from last month.

The preliminary April prices for flaxseed and oats as well as fresh and processing potatoes were withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations. The navy bean price for March was also withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
