NORTH DAKOTA AGRICULTURAL PRICES

FARGO, ND, August 28, 2014 -- Preliminary prices received by farmers for spring wheat for August 2014 averaged \$5.54 per bushel, a decrease of 59 cents from the July price according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Durum wheat, at \$8.33 per bushel, increased 10 cents from the previous month. Winter wheat averaged \$5.00 per bushel, a decrease of 72 cents from July.

The preliminary August feed barley price, at \$2.80 per bushel, is down 34 cents from last month. The malting barley price, at \$5.50, is down 35 cents from last month.

The preliminary August oat price, at \$2.71 per bushel, decreased 22 cents from last month.

The preliminary August corn price, at \$3.11 per bushel, decreased 56 cents from last month.

The preliminary August soybean price, at \$10.90 per bushel, is down 80 cents from last month.

The preliminary August all dry edible bean price, at \$27.10 per cwt, decreased \$4.80 from last month. The pinto price for July averaged \$30.60 per cwt.

The preliminary August all sunflowers price, at \$24.10 per cwt, is down 60 cents from the previous month.

The preliminary August flaxseed price, at \$13.50 per bushel, is down 50 cents from last month.

The preliminary August canola price averaged \$18.00 per cwt, a decrease of \$2.70 from July.

The August alfalfa hay price, at \$92.00 per ton, is up \$3.00 from last month. The other hay price, at \$60.00 per ton, is down \$2.00 from last month.

The preliminary August prices for fresh and processing potatoes were withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations. The navy bean price for July was also withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
