NORTH DAKOTA AGRICULTURAL PRICES

FARGO, ND, September 29, 2014 -- Preliminary prices received by farmers for spring wheat for September 2014 averaged \$5.53 per bushel, a decrease of 18 cents from the August price according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Durum wheat, at \$7.60 per bushel, decreased 32 cents from the previous month. Winter wheat averaged \$4.46 per bushel, a decrease of 60 cents from August.

The preliminary September feed barley price, at \$2.50 per bushel, is down 60 cents from last month. The malting barley price, at \$5.70, is down 26 cents from last month.

The preliminary September oat price, at \$2.30 per bushel, decreased 3 cents from last month.

The preliminary September corn price, at \$2.88 per bushel, decreased 47 cents from last month.

The preliminary September soybean price, at \$9.40 per bushel, is down \$1.30 from last month.

The preliminary September all dry edible bean price, at \$27.50 per cwt, increased \$1.70 from last month.

The preliminary September all sunflowers price, at \$23.00 per cwt, is down \$1.40 from the previous month.

The preliminary September flaxseed price, at \$12.50 per bushel, is down 80 cents from last month.

The preliminary September canola price averaged \$16.00 per cwt, a decrease of \$1.80 from August.

The September alfalfa hay price, at \$84.00 per ton, is down \$8.00 from last month. The other hay price, at \$59.00 per ton, is down \$1.00 from last month.

The preliminary September prices for fresh and processing potatoes were withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations. The pinto and navy bean prices for August were also withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
