NORTH DAKOTA AGRICULTURAL PRICES

FARGO, ND, October 31, 2014 -- Preliminary prices received by farmers for spring wheat for October 2014 averaged \$5.08 per bushel, a decrease of 27 cents from the September price according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Durum wheat, at \$7.58 per bushel, decreased 16 cents from the previous month. Winter wheat averaged \$4.39 per bushel, an increase of 4 cents from September.

The preliminary October feed barley price, at \$2.30 per bushel, is down 32 cents from last month. The malting barley price, at \$5.23, is down 46 cents from last month.

The preliminary October oat price, at \$2.68 per bushel, increased 44 cents from last month.

The preliminary October corn price, at \$2.65 per bushel, decreased 29 cents from last month.

The preliminary October soybean price, at \$8.90 per bushel, is down \$1.20 from last month.

The preliminary October all dry edible bean price, at \$25.40 per cwt, decreased \$3.70 from last month. The pinto price for September averaged \$27.30 per cwt.

The preliminary October all sunflowers price, at \$21.80 per cwt, is up \$2.00 from the previous month.

The preliminary October flaxseed price, at \$11.50 per bushel, is down 20 cents from last month.

The preliminary October canola price averaged \$15.50 per cwt, a decrease of 70 cents from September.

The October alfalfa hay price, at \$80.00 per ton, is down \$4.00 from last month. The other hay price, at \$55.00 per ton, is also down \$4.00 from last month.

The preliminary October prices for fresh and processing potatoes were withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations. The navy bean price for September was also withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
