## **NORTH DAKOTA AGRICULTURAL PRICES**

FARGO, ND, December 30, 2014 -- Preliminary prices received by farmers for spring wheat in December 2014 averaged \$5.87 per bushel, an increase of 54 cents from the November price according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Durum wheat, at \$11.30 per bushel, increased 30 cents from the previous month. Winter wheat averaged \$4.70 per bushel, an increase of 52 cents from November.

The preliminary December feed barley price, at \$2.80 per bushel, is down 15 cents from last month. The malting barley price, at \$5.54, is down 6 cents from last month.

The preliminary December corn price, at \$3.29 per bushel, increased 2 cents from last month.

The preliminary December soybean price, at \$9.53 per bushel, is up 7 cents from last month.

The preliminary December all dry edible bean price, at \$29.70 per cwt, increased \$1.60 from last month. The pinto price for November averaged \$27.10 per cwt while the navy price averaged \$31.90 per cwt.

The preliminary December all sunflowers price, at \$21.80 per cwt, is up \$1.30 from the previous month.

The preliminary December flaxseed price, at \$11.50 per bushel, is down 10 cents from last month.

The preliminary December canola price averaged \$16.80 per cwt, a decrease of 30 cents from November.

The December alfalfa hay price, at \$85.00 per ton, is up \$2.00 from last month. The other hay price, at \$59.00 per ton, is unchanged from last month.

The preliminary December prices for oats as well as fresh and processing potatoes were withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
