Ohio June 1 Grain Stocks

On June 1, 2017, Ohio corn stocks totaled 171.7 million bushels, 3 percent below a year earlier, according to Cheryl Turner, State Statistician, Ohio Field Office of USDA, NASS. About 45 percent of the corn was stored on farms. The third quarter disappearance was 166.7 million bushels, compared with 133.6 million bushels a year earlier. Soybean stocks on June 1, 2017, were 61.7 million bushels. That was 18 percent higher than stocks a year earlier. The third quarter indicated disappearance was 66.3 million bushels, compared with 44.6 million bushels during the same period a year ago. Farm stocks of soybeans were 21.5 million bushels. Wheat stocks on June 1, 2017, were 49.3 million bushels, 35 percent above a year ago. Over 99 percent of wheat stocks were in commercial storage. Fourth quarter indicated disappearance was 11.1 million bushels, compared with 6.4 million bushels during the same period last year.

U.S. corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2017, totaled 5.23 billion bushels, up 11 percent from June 1, 2016. Of the total stocks, 2.84 billion bushels were stored on farms, up 15 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, 2.38 billion bushels, were up 6 percent from a year ago. The March – May 2017 indicated disappearance was 3.40 billion bushels, compared with 3.11 billion bushels during the same period last year. Soybeans stored in all positions on June 1, 2017, totaled 963 million bushels, up 11 percent from June 1, 2016. Soybean stocks stored on farms were estimated at 333 million bushels, up 18 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, 631 million bushels, were up 7 percent from last June. Indicated disappearance for the March – May 2017 quarter totaled 775 million bushels, up 18 percent from the same period a year earlier. Old crop all wheat stored in all positions on June 1, 2017, totaled 1.18 billion bushels, up 21 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks were estimated at 192 million bushels, down 3 percent from last June. Off-farm stocks, 993 million bushels, were up 28 percent from a year ago. The March – May 2017 indicated disappearance was 472 million bushels, up 19 percent from the same period a year earlier.
