Ohio Farm Numbers

The number of farms in Ohio in 2020 was 77,800, according to Cheryl Turner, State Statistician of the USDA, NASS, Ohio Field Office. Land in farms was 13.6 million acres, unchanged from last year. The average size farm in Ohio was 175 acres per farm, unchanged from 2019.

The number of farms in the United States for 2020 is estimated at 2,019,000, down 4,400 farms from 2019. Total land in farms, at 896,600,000 acres, decreased 800,000 acres from 2019. The average farm size for 2020 is 444 acres, unchanged from the previous year.

A farm is defined as any establishment from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were produced and sold, or normally would have been sold during the year. The \$1,000 threshold can be met by any combination of sales and government payments. Land in farms includes: crop and livestock acreage, wasteland, woodland, pasture, land in summer fallow, idle cropland, land enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program, and other set-aside or commodity acreage programs.
