Issued February 26, 2018

Precipitation levels continued to be rated below normal throughout the state, with the largest departures recorded in the North Central district at 39 percent below normal. According to OCS Mesonet, the statewide average precipitation for the full month of February was 3.85 inches. As of February 20th, 38 percent of the state was in the extreme to exceptional drought categories up, 38 points from the previous year and 89 percent of the state was in the severe to exceptional drought categories, up 62 points from the previous year. Statewide temperatures averaged in the high 30's, with the lowest recording of -1 degree at Camargo on Monday, February 26th and the highest recording of 84 degrees at Freedom on Wednesday, February 14th. Topsoil moisture conditions were rated mostly adequate to very short and subsoil moisture conditions were rated mostly very short to short.

Small Grains: Winter wheat grazed reached 46 percent, down 19 points from the previous year. Rye grazed reached 64 percent, down 6 points from the previous year. Oats grazed reached 40 percent, down 30 points from the previous year.

Pasture and Livestock: Conditions of pasture and range were rated at 75 percent fair to poor. Livestock condition was rated at 92 percent good to fair.
