Weekly Summary for June 14 – June 20

Issued June 21, 2021

Rainfall totals in Oklahoma were only trace amounts, with the Southeast district recording the highest total at 0.07 of an inch. According to the June 15th US Drought Monitor Report, drought conditions were rated 15 percent abnormally dry to exceptional drought, unchanged previous week. Additionally, 5 percent of the state was in the moderate drought to exceptional drought category, down 1 point from the previous week. Statewide, temperatures averaged in the low 80's. Topsoil moisture conditions were rated mostly adequate to short, and subsoil moisture conditions were rated adequate to short. There were 6.4 days suitable for fieldwork.

Small Grains: Winter wheat harvested reached 50 percent, down 29 points from the previous year and down 16 points from normal. Canola harvested reached 39 percent, down 18 points from the previous year and down 29 points from normal. Rye harvested reached 39 percent, down 9 points from the previous year and down 12 points from normal. Oats headed reached 92 percent, up 13 points from the previous year and up 4 points from normal. Oats harvested reached 20 percent, up 2 points from the previous year but down 9 points from normal.

Row Crops: Corn emerged reached 91 percent, up 2 points from the previous year but unchanged from normal. Corn silk reached 5 percent, down 1 point from the previous year and down 7 points from normal. Sorghum planted reached 63 percent, down 10 points from the previous year and down 10 points from normal. Soybeans planted reached 58 percent, down 19 points from the previous year and down 13 points from normal. Soybeans emerged reached 19 percent, down 47 points from the previous year and down 33 points from normal. Peanuts planted reached 90 percent, up 11 points from the previous year but down 2 points from normal. Peanuts pegging reached 4 percent, down 2 points from the previous year but unchanged from normal. Cotton planted reached 75 percent, down 8 points from the previous year and down 14 points from normal.

Hay: The first cutting of alfalfa hay reached 90 percent, up 4 points from the previous year and up 1 point from normal. The second cutting of alfalfa hay reached 39 percent, down 3 points from the previous year but unchanged from normal. The first cutting of other hay reached 70 percent, down 1 point from the previous year and down 2 points from normal.

Pasture and Livestock: Pasture and range condition was rated at 86 percent good to fair. Livestock condition was rated at 89 percent good to fair.
