Weekly Summary for October 25 – 31

Issued November 1, 2021

Rainfall totals in Oklahoma averaged 0.91 of an inch, with the East Central district recording the highest total at 1.86 inches. According to the October 26th US Drought Monitor Report, drought conditions were rated 95 percent abnormally dry to exceptional drought, up 1 point from the previous week. Additionally, 41 percent of the state was in the moderate drought to exceptional drought category, up 3 points from the previous week. Statewide, temperatures averaged in the high 50's. Topsoil and subsoil moisture conditions were rated mostly adequate to short. There were 5.7 days suitable for fieldwork.

Small Grains: Winter wheat planted reached 85 percent, down 2 points from the previous year and down 1 point from normal. Winter wheat emerged reached 68 percent, down 2 points from the previous year and down 6 points from normal. Canola planted reached 77 percent, down 3 points from the previous year but unchanged from normal. Canola emerged reached 7 percent. Rye planted reached 80 percent, down 9 points from the previous year and down 8 points from normal. Rye emerged reached 39 percent, down 10 points from the previous year and down 18 points from normal. Oats planted reached 40 percent, down 5 points from both the previous year and normal.

Row Crops: Corn harvested reached 92 percent, up 3 points from the previous year and up 4 points from normal. Sorghum harvested reached 64 percent, up 5 points from the previous year but unchanged from normal. Soybeans dropping leaves reached 89 percent, up 5 points from both the previous year and normal. Soybeans harvested reached 48 percent, up 7 points from the previous year and up 4 points from normal. Peanuts mature reached 93 percent, up 1 point from the previous year but unchanged from normal. Peanuts harvested reached 44 percent, down 17 points from the previous year and down 15 points from normal. Cotton harvested reached 32 percent, up 5 points from the previous year and up 1 point from normal.

Hay: The fifth cutting of alfalfa hay reached 42 percent, up 2 points from the previous year and up 11 points from normal. The third cutting of other hay reached 67 percent, up 8 points from the previous year and up 4 points from normal. The fourth cutting of other hay reached 15 percent, up 9 points from the previous year but down 8 points from normal.

Pasture and Livestock: Pasture and range condition was rated at 84 percent fair to good. Livestock condition was rated at 91 percent good to fair.
