Weekly Summary for June 6 – 12

Issued June 13, 2022

Rainfall totals in Oklahoma averaged 2.08 inches. According to the June 7th US Drought Monitor Report, drought conditions were rated 43 percent abnormally dry to exceptional drought, down 9 points from the previous week. Additionally, 35 percent of the state was in the moderate drought to exceptional drought category, down 8 points from the previous week. Statewide, temperatures averaged in the upper 70's. Topsoil and subsoil moisture conditions were rated mostly adequate to short. There were 3.3 days suitable for fieldwork.

Small Grains: Winter wheat harvested reached 32 percent, up 23 points from the previous year but down 1 point from normal. Canola coloring reached 88 percent, up 8 points from the previous year but unchanged from normal. Canola harvested reached 15 percent, up 2 points from the previous year but down 22 points from normal. Rye harvested reached 25 percent, up 13 points from the previous year but down 4 points from normal. Oats jointing reached 95 percent, unchanged from the previous year but up 1 point from normal. Oats headed reached 80 percent, down 3 points from the previous year and down 1 point from normal.

Row Crops: Corn planted reached 90 percent, up 1 point from the previous year but down 1 point from normal. Corn emerged reached 80 percent, up 3 points from the previous year but down 3 points from normal. Sorghum planted reached 45 percent, up 6 points from the previous year but down 7 points from normal. Soybeans planted reached 55 percent, up 10 points from the previous year but down 4 points from normal. Soybeans emerged reached 30 percent. Peanuts planted reached 60 percent, down 14 points from the previous year and down 19 points from normal. Cotton planted reached 62 percent, up 4 points from the previous year but down 5 points from normal.

Hay: The first cutting of alfalfa hay reached 62 percent, down 15 points from the previous year and down 17 points from normal. The first cutting of other hay reached 55 percent, up 1 point from the previous year but down 2 points from normal.

Pasture and Livestock: Pasture and range condition was rated at 78 percent good to fair. Livestock condition was rated at 85 percent good to fair.
