This report contains the results from the September 2016 Hog and Pig Survey. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next quarterly survey will be made available December 23, 2016.

Oklahoma Highlights

The September 1, 2016 Oklahoma hog and pig inventory, at 2.20 million head, was 2 percent lower than September 2015. The number of **breeding hogs** totaled 455 thousand head, down 15 thousand from last year. The September 1 **market hog** inventory was down 1 percent from a year ago at 1.75 million head, 80 percent of the total hog and pig inventory.

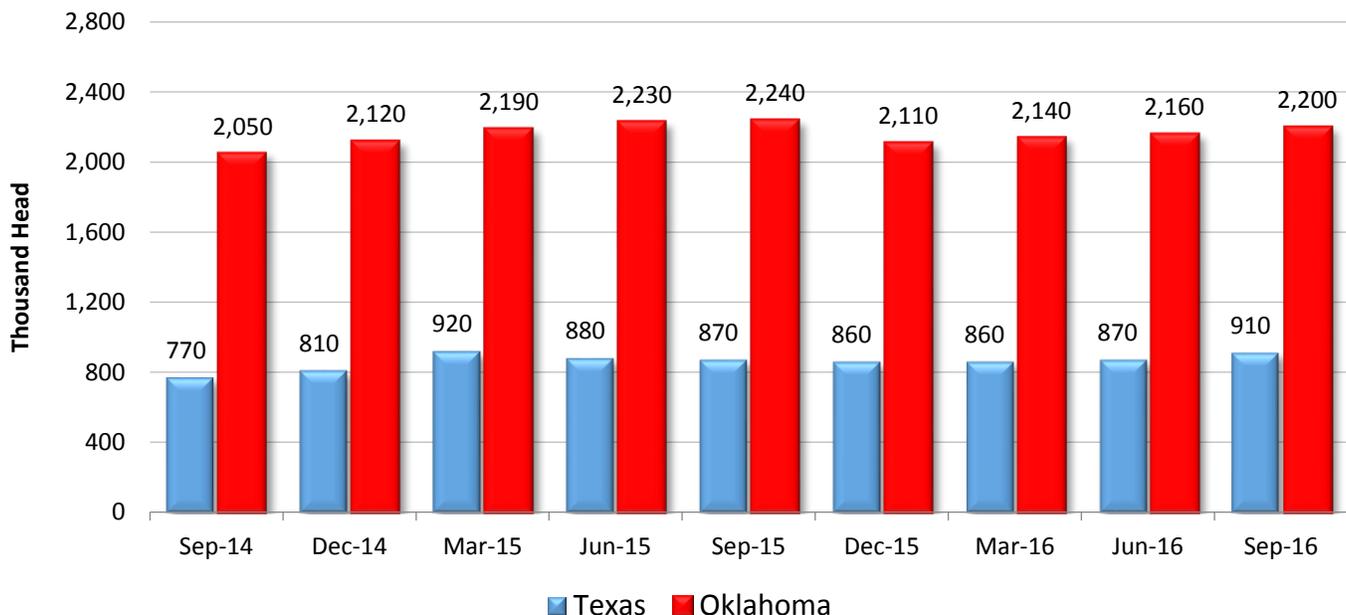
The June 2016-August 2016 Oklahoma **pig crop** totaled 2.13 million head, 5 percent above last year. Pigs per litter averaged 10.7, up 3 percent from the previous year. Sows farrowed during June 2016 through August 2016 totaled 200 thousand head, up 3 percent from last year.

Texas Highlights

The September 1, 2016 Texas hog and pig inventory, at 910 thousand head, was 5 percent higher than September 2015. The number of **breeding hogs** totaled 100 thousand head, down 5 thousand from last year. The September 1 **market hog** inventory was up 6 percent from a year ago at 810 thousand head, 89 percent of the total hog and pig inventory.

The June 2016-August 2016 Texas **pig crop** totaled 400 thousand head, 9 percent below last year. Pigs per litter averaged 9.3, up 3 percent from the previous year. Sows farrowed during June 2016 through August 2016 totaled 43.0 thousand head, down 12 percent from last year.

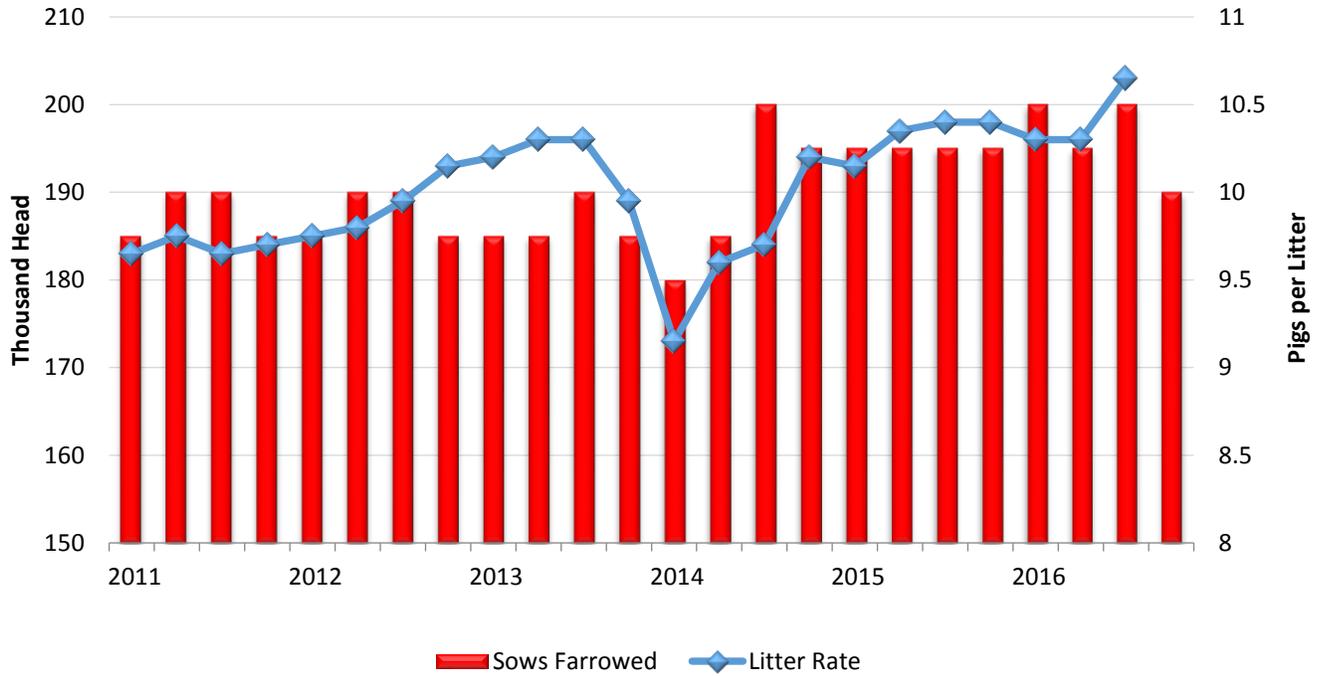

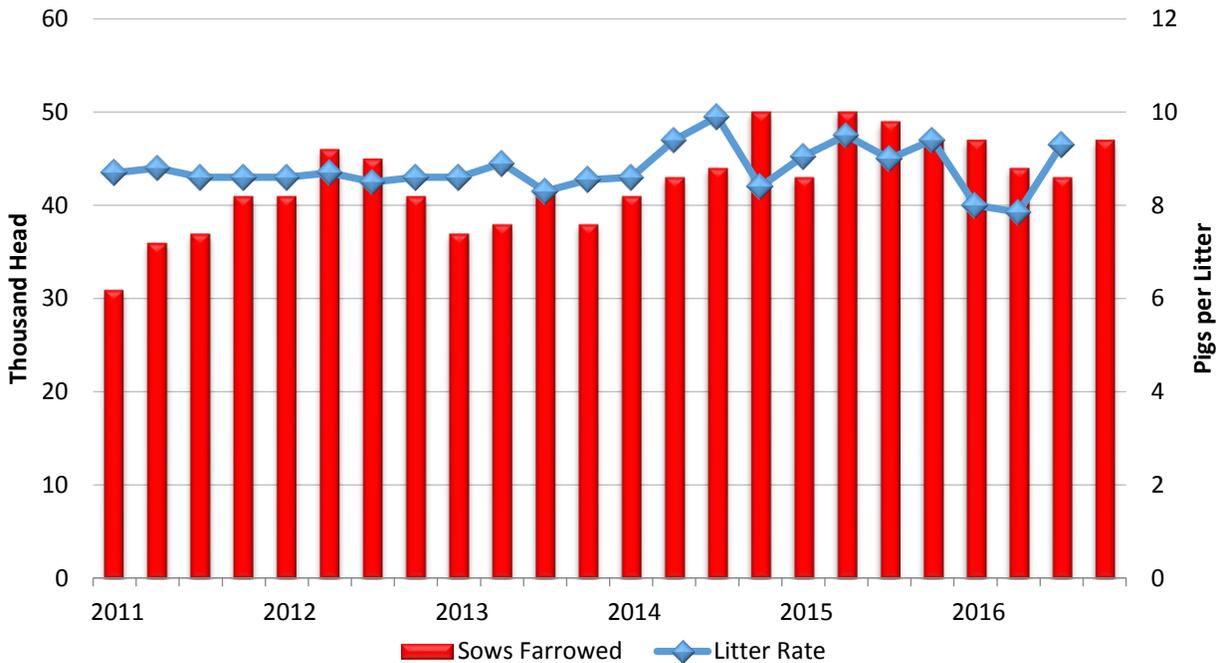

U.S. Highlights

The U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on September 1, 2016, is estimated at 70.9 million head, up 2 percent from a year ago and up 4 percent from June 1, 2016. The **breeding hog inventory**, at 6.02 million head, was up 1 percent from last year and up 1 percent from the previous quarter. **Market hog** inventory, at 64.8 million head, was up 3 percent from last year and up 4 percent from last quarter.

The U.S. **pig crop** for June 2016-August 2016, at 32.0 million, was up 2 percent from 2015. U.S. producers intend to have 2.93 million sows farrow during the September 2016-November 2016 period, down slightly from the actual farrowings during the same period last year. Intended farrowings for December 2016-February 2017, at 2.93 million sows, are up 1 percent from the same quarter the year prior.
