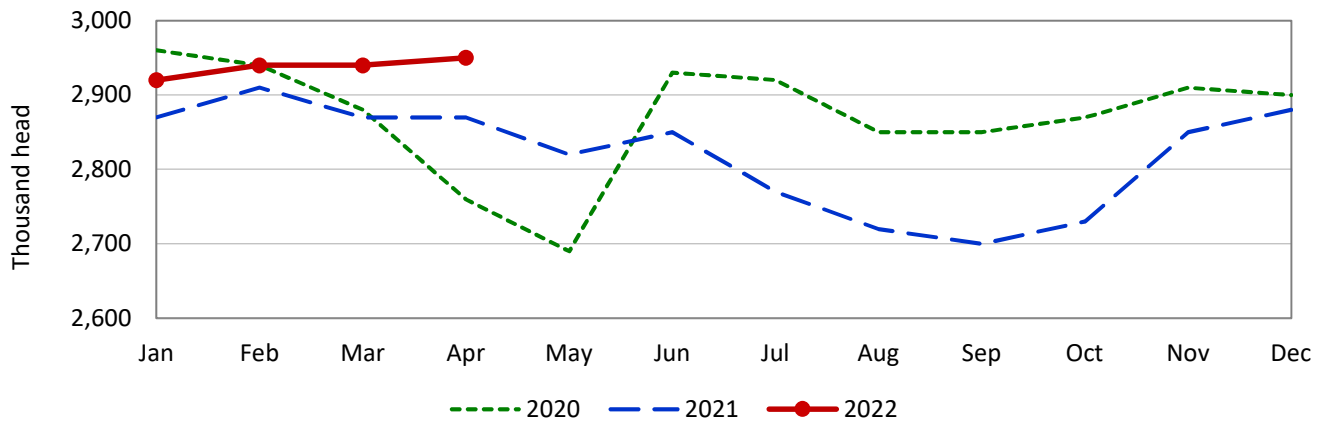

This report contains results from the April 2022 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of April. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on May 20, 2022.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.95 million head on April 1, 2022, up 3 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 435 thousand head in commercial feedlots during March, down 6 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 415 thousand head during March, down 9 percent from 2021.

On April 1, there were 2.61 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 88 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was up 3 percent from last year and up slightly from the March 1 total. March placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 393 thousand head, up 28 percent from the February total. Marketings were up 25 percent from last month at 376 thousand head.

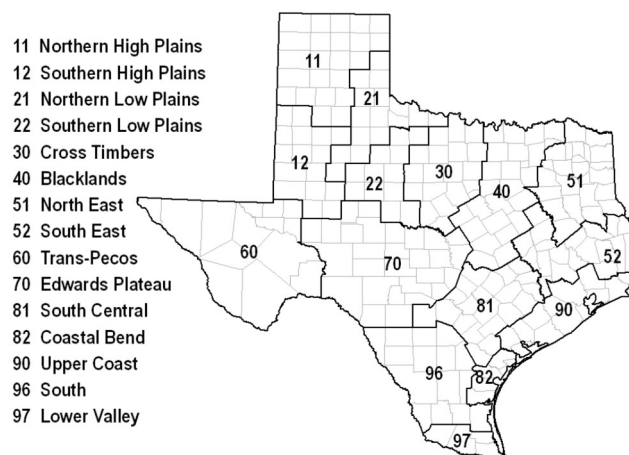

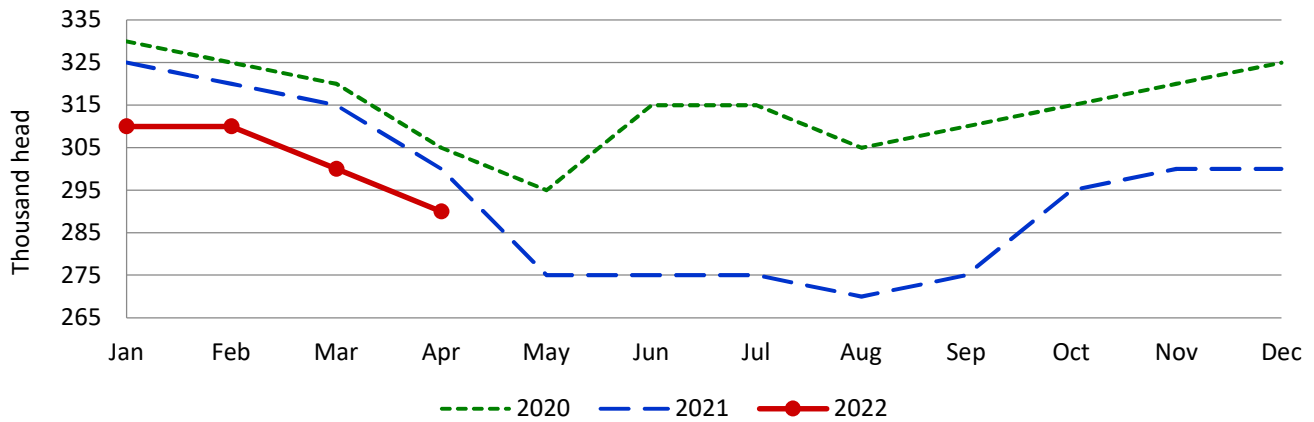
¹ Cattle and calves on feed are animals for slaughter market being fed a ration of grain or other concentrates and are expected to produce a carcass that will grade select or better.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Oklahoma** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 290 thousand head on April 1, 2022, down 3 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 45 thousand head in commercial feedlots during March, down 18 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 54 thousand head during March, down 22 percent from 2021. Other disappearance during March totaled 1 thousand head, unchanged from a year ago.
