

This report contains results from the April 2024 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of April. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on May 24, 2024.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.84 million head on April 1, 2024, up 1 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 365 thousand head in commercial feedlots during March, down 20 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 330 thousand head during March, down 20 percent from 2023.

On April 1, there were 2.52 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was unchanged from last year but up 1 percent from the March 1 total. March placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 323 thousand head, up 1 percent from the February total. Marketings were down 6 percent from last month at 289 thousand head.


Texas Cattle and Calves on Feed in 1,000+ Capacity Feedlots, by District



Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in Oklahoma feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 330 thousand head on April 1, 2024, up 27 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 41 thousand head in commercial feedlots during March, down 5 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 40 thousand head during March, down 23 percent from 2023. Other disappearance during March totaled 1 thousand head, unchanged from a year ago.
