

U.S. Sweet Cherry Production Forecast Up 60 Percent From Last Year

United States sweet cherry total production for 2023 is forecast at 371,000 tons, up 60 percent from 2022. In Washington, the largest producing State, total production for 2023 is forecast at 240,000 tons, up 66 percent from 2022. In Oregon, total production for 2023 is forecast at 51,000 tons, up 59 percent from 2022.

U.S. Tart Cherry Production Forecast Down 17 Percent From Last Year

United States tart cherry total production for 2023 is forecast at 203 million pounds, down 17 percent from the 2022 production. In Washington, total production for 2023 is forecast at 26.0 million pounds.
